### ***International Citation in the qualification of Doctor***

#### ***Article 18. International citation in the qualification of doctor***

*1. The qualification of doctor may include on the reverse the citation "International Doctor" under the following concurrent circumstances:*

- a) That during the mandatory training period to obtain the qualification of doctor, the candidate spent a minimum of three months out of Spain in a higher education centre or prestigious research centre taking courses or undertaking research tasks. This fellowship and the activities must be endorsed by the director and authorised by the Academic Commission and added to the doctoral candidate's activities document.*
- b) That part of the doctoral thesis (at least the abstract and conclusions) are written and presented in one of the common languages for scientific communication in their field of knowledge, that is not one of the official languages of Spain. This criterion will not be applicable when the stays, reports and experts are from a Spanish-speaking country.*
- c) That the thesis has been informed by at least two expert doctors from a non-Spanish higher education establishment or research institute.*
- d) That at least one expert belongs to a non-Spanish higher education establishment or research centre, holding the title of doctor, and is not responsible for the stay mentioned in section a), who is part of the thesis assessment tribunal.*

*2. The thesis defence must be done at the University of Zaragoza, where the candidate must be registered or, for joint doctoral programmes, at any of the participating universities or under the terms identified in the collaboration agreements.*

*3. The stay mentioned in point 1a) may take place in different stages, of lesser duration in the case of part-time candidates or for those who are full time but who have reasons that the Academic Commission accepts as justifiable.*

*4. Should there have been various stays in different places, none of those responsible for the different stays may be involved in the tribunal.*

**3.- Establishment of a minimum stay:** In its meeting on 17 January 2011, the Doctoral Commission agreed, as a general principle, in line with the criteria used by ANECA to value research visits, that for periods of less than 3 months, the minimum timeframe accountable would be one month, except under exceptional concurrent circumstances.
