Introduction

More than thirteen years have passed since the March 11th disasters, yet the impact of the Fukushima disasters continues to affect those living in the prefecture. Over thirty thousand evacuated citizens remain without a permanent home or a stable source of income, and concerns, often unsubstantiated, about radioactive contamination continue to bedevil small businesses and industries within the prefecture. The Fukushima Ambassadors Program is an opportunity for students around the world to see, hear, and reflect objectively upon the challenges faced in Fukushima today. By implementing a collaborative learning, community-service-based approach to global education, the program will help students evaluate any misconceptions they may have about post-3/11 Fukushima, and become, if they wish, an ambassador to its recovery.

About the Program

Program Focus

To provide students from a mixed group dynamic a hands-on learning opportunity that focuses on the chronologic physical, economic, and social consequences of the tsunami and subsequent nuclear accident in Fukushima.

Overall Aims of the Program

[Knowledge]

- Further the student's understanding of the impacts that the 3.11 disaster has had on the lives of the people living in Fukushima
- Dispel any misconceptions students may have had of Fukushima prior to participation
- Help students identify ways they can apply their current learning to issues in Fukushima

(Skills)

- Improve intercultural working/communication skills by implementing a mixed group dynamic
- Enable students to analyze, evaluate, and create messages in a wide variety of media modes, genres, and formats regarding Fukushima
- Help students get better at communicating Fukushima's issues to the world (language selection, approach, etc.)

[Passion]

Help students become, if they wish, an agent for change in the revitalization efforts after returning home

Example Activities

- In-depth tour of disaster-affected towns and businesses across Fukushima Prefecture
- Tour of the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant
- Lectures and field studies on issues faced in Fukushima, including radiation monitoring, restoration planning, public health, energy policy, economic recovery, and media literacy
- Volunteer work in formerly evacuated communities

Program cost

All fees <u>excluding</u> flight expenses and meal costs (except for breakfast provided by hotels) will be covered by Fukushima University.

Program Hours

Approximately 60 hours of instruction through lectures, fieldwork, and group workshops will be provided over a 16-day program.

A tentative itinerary will be made available to you by early May 2024.

Credits Given

A certificate of completion and 2 academic credits will be granted from Fukushima University to participants coming from partner universities with student exchanges with Fukushima University. For students from all other universities, a certificate of completion will be issued.

Rules and Regulations

Airport Transportation

Fukushima University will charter a bus from Narita Airport to Fukushima Station and back. There will be one group pick-up and one group drop-off at **Narita International Airport** on the date of program arrival and departure. In the event of a participant missing his/her flight or choosing to arrive in Fukushima on an alternate date, the participant will be responsible for making his/her own travel arrangements to Fukushima City.

Meeting Times (Important)

Since Narita Airport is located about 5 hours away from Fukushima City by Bus, for those boarding the chartered bus on the program arrival date, we ask that you book a flight that arrives in Japan earlier than 14:00 (August 18th). If you cannot find a flight that arrives in this time slot, we kindly ask that you arrive a day early and arrange to book a hotel in the Narita/ Tokyo region.

For those wanting to board the program bus from Fukushima City to Narita Airport on the end date, we ask that you book a flight that leaves in the afternoon after 15:00 (September 2nd). If you cannot find a flight that departs in this time slot, we kindly ask that you arrange for alternate transportation to the airport.

Accommodation

Participants will be staying at a hotel in Fukushima City with full access to wireless internet. Cost for the hotels are included in the program fee.

Health, Travel and Accident Insurance

Fukushima University will not cover individual health, accident, or travel insurance. It is a program requirement that this be

organized in your home country before departure. It is requested that information regarding the participant's health, accident,

and travel insurance be provided to Fukushima University before arrival.

Loss of Program Eligibility

Fukushima University holds the right to expel any person(s) from the program if found to be involved in any illegal activities

as defined under local Japanese law during the program, as well as any person(s) acting in a discriminatory and/or abusive

manner towards other participants. In such cases, the subject asked to leave the program will be responsible for arranging

and paying for their own lodging and travel expenses from thereon until their return date to their home country.
